FLOOD PROTECTING YOUR PROPERTY

It's that time of the year again! Time to remind everyone to prepare our homes and property for the arrival of winter weather. Getting prepared before the winter rains strike can reduce the stress of property damage or loss. Fortunately, major flooding is not a common occurrence in Orange County. However, even damage generated by minor flooding can be inconvenient and costly. The following tips are offered to remind you of a few precautions in case our City incurs heavy rains and flooding this winter season.

Preplanning is key to being prepared!

- Make an itemized list of personal property, including furnishings, clothing, and valuables. Photographs of your home inside and out are helpful.
- Clear rain gutters and down spouts of debris. Remove dirt, weeds or other materials from drainage systems. Keep water flowing away from your home and into proper drainage systems!
- Inspect your roof for missing shingles or tiles. Now is the time to repair, before the wet weather comes along.
- If you should have to evacuate in a hurry, learn the safest route from your home or place of business to safe ground.
- Keep a portable (battery powered) radio and emergency supplies handy - flashlights, candles, first aid supplies and medications, Emergency phone numbers for your utility companies.
- Sandbags - Sandbags are available from the San Juan Capistrano City Hall Public Works. Your local Fire Department and City facilities provide sand as well. If a heavy storm threatens, properly placed sandbags can be your first line of defense to circumvent unwanted water damage.

FLOOD ZONE INFORMATION

Homeowners and business people often need to know whether or not their property is situated in a floodplain. The City maintains floodplain maps provided by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). As a service to the community, the Engineering Division provides map determinations to advise people whether or not their property or structures are subject to potential flooding within the floodplain and identifies the flood zone the property is located in. Inquires need to be accompanied by the property address and the general location of the property. In addition to map determinations, the Engineering Division also provides information on flood insurance required by the National Flood Insurance Program. Flood Insurance Rate Map data, depths of potential flooding, site visit and floodproofing techniques.
